I. YWATHITGYI is a large village running along the North bank of the R. IRRAWADDY, about twenty-two miles west of MANDALAY.

1. Topographical

The village stretches about 1½ miles along the bank of the river, and is about 500 yds wide. It is thickly wooded and surrounded by very open country - mostly paddy fields. From this brief description it can be seen that the objective was a very large one for a single bn. However, owing to commitments elsewhere on the bde front, this was all the infantry force available for the task.

2. Enemy

The enemy left one Coy of 2 bn 124 regt with a few addtl tps to garrison the village. A total strength of just over a hundred all ranks. He had several MMGs, LMGs and GDs, and was supported by guns and mortars on the southern bank of the IRRAWADDY. Judging by what was learned from locals before the operation, and from what was learned from PWs and psns on the ground after, the enemy disposed his tps as far as can be assessed as follows:

At the eastern approaches to the village he had about 30 - 40 men covering the approaches and positioned in depth into the village itself. Judging by the number of empty posns left at the east end of the village he probably had alternative posns in depth well back into the village itself. These were very well concealed foxholes and bunkers. In the Old MILL and CEMETERY he had 20/30 tps, with MMGs and LMGs covering the open ground leading to the north of the village.

In the centre of YWATHITGYI in the PO area, and on the road leading north from it, was his HQ and about 20 men. The remainder of the force was probably defending the west end of the village, though evidence of this is not full. He had definitely a posn with an LMG at the Kyaung at 224598.

3. Plan

See operation order.

4. Operation

At 2300 hrs 30 Jan the Pioneer P1 left to lay tapes along the axis of adv and across the start line as on air photograph. This latter was to be the start line for the leading tps before the attack, and to act as a check to prevent them getting too close to the air strike. At 0230 the bn, less "A" Coy which was already at NGATHYAW LF2660, left NATKAYAING LF 2465 for the FUP area at approx 253604. Order of march was def pl, "C", "B", bn HQ, "D". It arrived in the FUP area at 0500 hrs and immediately dug in. Complete stillness had to be observed from first light onwards, owing to the proximity of the enemy and the necessity to ensure surprise. At 1030 hrs the def pl relieved "A" Coy, who then rejoined the bn.

At 1140 - 1230 the air bombardment began. It was carried out as follows (see Air Photo att)

1100 - 1200 three sqns MITCHELLS on A - F
1200 - 1210 two sqns THUNDERBOLTS on D - F
1210 - 1223 three sqns HBs - one on wood
at East end YWATHITYGYI
two on E and F.

Immediately after the air bombardment had ended, "B" Coy on the right and "C" on the left crossed the tape laid on the previous night, and by 1300 hrs had reached the eastern outskirts of YWATHITGYI, with little opposition, except for a few snipers. They pushed on against slightly heavier opposition to the rd running North from the DAK BUNGALOW, with tks and WASPS helping them fwd. It was on this rd that the enemy resistance began to stiffen. The enemy opened fire on the leading tps and the speed of the adv was halted temporarily. The enemy posns were extremely hard to pin-point, and each one had to be dealt with separately before further adv could be made. At 1345 one pl of "B" Coy with tp tks in sp under Lt Renwick was detached from the Coy, and ordered to go independently to the OLD MILL area. This pl started off with no opposition, until it reached approx 300 yds East of the MILL itself. Here it came under heavy MG fire from the MILL the cemetery and the North of the village. It suffered several casualties, including the RA FOO with it, and was pinned to the ground. At 1300 "D" Coy was ordered to stand by to move, and

At 1300 "D" Coy was ordered to stand by to move, and brought into immediate reserve. Major Russell, the coy comd reported to Tac HQ, which by now had established itself at approx 248598.

"B" and "C" Coys were still trying to push fwd, but the craters caused by the air strike considerably hindered the tks, who were unable to give the inf full support at this time. Meanwhile an arty conc had been arranged to help Lt. Renwick's pl fwd to the OLD MILL. This lasted from 1505 to 1515, after which the pl, supported by one tp tks, pushed fwd to within 30 yds of its objective. By this time it had been too depleted by casualties, to enable it to complete its task, and at 1530 the CO ordered "D" Coy to reinforce it, and capture the OLD MILL. Two dets mortars were put under comd OC "D" Coy. Owing to the thickness of the village, and the devastation caused by the air strike, the two coys in YWATHITGYI found it extremely hard to tell exactly how far they had advanced. The tks had been helping them fwd, and they thought that they were 3/400 yds short of the main rd running North from the PO. It was now 1630 hrs and the CO realised that the occupation of the whole objective before darkness would be impossible. He therefore gave coys a limited objective as follows. "B" and "C" Coys to make firm the village as far west as the main rd.

"D" Coy to continue attack on the MILL area.

"A" Coy to come into immediate reserve in the east end of the village from 242594, to incl the river bank. By 1700 hrs "B" Coy had reached the North of PAGODA at 239594 and "C" Coy was south of it. The tks were ordered to pull out for the night, and it was then impossible for the tps to get as far fwd as their limited objective. The CO therefore issued orders for them to consolidate for the night.

 $\ensuremath{\text{"D"}}$ Coy had taken the MILL area and was ordered to consolidate.

"A" Coy was on its way to the East end of the village, and consolidated the posn allotted to it by 1730 hrs. Bn HQ moved fwd and established itself in the KYAUNG at 242597.

After consolidation, patrols were sent fwd from "B" and "C" Coys, but located enemy MGs immediately to their front and were unable to exploit further.

The casualties suffered by the $\ensuremath{\mathtt{Bn}}$ during the days ops were

Killed 5 ORs Wounded Lt. Pomphrey and 15 ORs.
